

# What is Employment?

#### SOLOPRENEUR VS. ENTREPRENEUR

<u>Solopreneur</u>: Individual who starts and runs a business on their own, without the intention of growing it into a large company with employees.

<u>Entrepreneur</u>: Someone who starts and runs a business, typically with the goal of growth, scalability, and building a larger enterprise.

#### **SOLOPRENEUR**

- ✓ Operates solo without a team
- ✓ Focuses on small-scale business
- ✓ Takes on all roles
- ✓ Often works in industries where personal expertise or service is the key selling point
- ✓ Goal is personal freedom

#### **ENTREPRENEUR**

- ✓ May or may not operate with a team
- ✓ Often focuses on business growth
- ✓ May hire a team for additional roles
- ✓ Often seeks outside investments to support the growth of the business into new markets
- ✓ Goal is to achieve sustainable profits
